# **Past Continuous**

#### **Form**

	Positive	<b>Example</b>
	$S_1 + was + V.$ (ing) + comp.	
1	_	He was working.
	S <sub>1</sub> : I, He, She, It, singular name	
	$S_2 + were + V. (ing) + comp.$	
2	_	They were working.
	S <sub>2</sub> : We, You, They, plural name	

	Negative	Example
1	$S_1 + was not + V. (ing) + comp.$	He was not working.
2	$S_2$ + were not + V. (ing) + comp.	They were not working.

**Note:** The auxiliary verbs in the Past Continuous Tense are: was & were.

# **Questions**

WH questions	WH word + aux. $V + S + V(ing) + comp$ ?
Yes/no questions	$\mathbf{aux.}\ \mathbf{V} + \mathbf{S} + \mathbf{V(ing)} + \mathbf{comp?}$

### **Example: WH questions**

	was	I / he / she / it / singular name	
What	were	we / you / they / plural name	doing?

Example: Yes/no questions

Was	I / he / she / it / singular name	
Were	we / you / they / plural name	watching TV?

# <u>Use</u>

We often use the Past Continuous in sentences with the Past Simple. The Past Continuous refers to longer, background activities, while the Past Simple refers to shorter, completed actions.

# **Past Perfect**

# **Form**

The form of the Past Perfect is the same for all types of subjects.

#### **Positive**

	S + had + V (p.p.) + comp.		
Rule	S: I, They, We, You, He, She, It, any type of name		
	V (past participant):	adding (ed) to verbs or irregular verbs.	
	I He/She/It		
Evennle	We	had won the game	
Example	You	had won the game.	
	They		
	any type of name		

# Negative

Rule	S + had not + V (p.p.) + comp.		
Example	I He/She/It We You They any type of name	had not won the game.	

# **Questions**

### WH questions

Rule	WH word + had + $S + V(p.p.) + comp?$			
Example	Where	had	you he they :	travelled last year?

#### Yes/no questions

Rule	$\mathbf{Had} + \mathbf{S} + \mathbf{V.(p.p.)} + \mathbf{comp?}$
Example	Had he already left?

**Note:** The auxiliary verb (aux. V) in the Past Perfect tense is: had.

### <u>Use</u>

The Past Perfect is used to indicate clearly that one action in the past happened before another action in the past.

# Past tenses in the passive

#### **Form**

<b>Past Simple Passive</b>	was / were + V(p.p.)
<b>Past Continuous Passive</b>	was / were + being + $V(p.p.)$
<b>Past Perfect Passive</b>	had been $+ V(p.p.)$

#### <u>Use</u>

The uses are the same in the passive as in the active.

# **Examples**

These houses were built in 1985.

The bridge was being reshaped when it collapsed.

The letter didn't arrive because it had been sent to my old address.
